Ottawa, Ont., April 29.—It was announced at the fifth annual meeting of the Canadian Club last night that Lord Milner, formerly High Commissioner for South Africa, is to visit Canada during the coming fall and that he has accepted an invitation to address members of the Canadian Club.

A verdict of \$3260 has been awarded by the jury to Johnny Meehan, aged fourteen, in his suit against the Woodward Department Stores, in which he sought \$10,000 for serious injuries, including the loss of one eye.
