Dominion Officers and Provincial Police Working at Opposite Ends of Chain:

#### HEADQUARTERS IN STATES

Leaders of Movement Have Been Located in New York and Chicago.

That the bombs which the Hindus are making secretly at Millside on the banks of the Fraser river, contain more gunpowder and rusty nails than hot air was evidenced today by the interest it is learned the Dominion secret service and the provincial police are taking in investigating the conspiracy and running down the leaders of the insurrectionary move-

The federal police have been quietly at work on the matter for some time, but so far their operations have time, but so far their operations have been confined to New York and Chicago and R is only now that their operations are about to be extended to the coast cities of Vancouver, deattles and New Westminster.
